

TIPS — from YOOF on how to be good sleuths —

DURING THE FIRST ROUND OF QUESTIONING :

1. At the beginning – concentrate on **getting to know the characters** – what they think about things – don't worry too much about where they were at the time of death (that will be important later).
2. Really think about whether they might have a **motive** or not. They are a pretty horrible group of people actually and perhaps any one of them might have done it. But you should work hard in the early part at trying to understand what each character's motive might have been
3. Ask general questions – don't be too specific

DURING THE SECOND ROUND OF QUESTIONING

1. This is the time to think harder about how the murder was actually done. Hopefully you'll have some idea as to why it might have happened but remember that the murderer must have been **able** to have done it
2. Clarify anything else - you will at the end be able to ask any character back.
